AWARDS

All submissions accompanied by a Full Paper or Extended Abstract will be considered for recognition in the appropriate Award Category.

Jasper Mardon Memorial Prize (Full Paper Required)

This prize is awarded for the Conference Paper which, in the opinion of the judging panel, has the greatest contribution to the science and technology of papermaking. All papers covering research, operations, troubleshooting and reviews of papermaking, from thick stock system to finishing are eligible. The prize is judged on the full paper being published in the Conference Proceedings, and plaques are awarded to all authors of the prize-winning paper.

Best Mill Paper (Extended Abstract Required)

The Best Mill Paper Prize is sponsored by the Appita Sustaining Members and Suppliers Group and is awarded to the best paper presented at the conference by a person working in a pulp and/or paper mill. It is based on technical content, quality of oral presentation, and audience interest. Valued at AUD2000, the prize is to be used for professional development.
